PREVENTION

Whether you prefer online shopping or in-person, taking precautions to prevent victimization and/ or avoid scams is pivotal to personal safety. Consider the following to ensure security measures are established in any setting.

In the Parking Lot:

- Be alert and off your cell phone when in a parking lot.
- Always park in an open and well-lit area.
- Be ready to unlock your car before leaving a store.
- Don't resist if someone tries to take any of your belongings nothing is worth your life.

In-Store Shopping:

- Teach children to ask store personnel or security for help if you become separated.
- Ensure that children know their full name and your cell phone number.
- Be cognizant of your valuables and keep purses or wallets close to your body.
- Don't store gifts in your car. Remember to bring everything into your home.

Online Shopping:

- Only shop through trusted sources when shopping online.
- Never connect to unsecure public wi-fi for online shopping.
- Confirm your anti-virus software is updated on your home computer and mobile devices.
- Check your credit card and bank statements for fraudulent charges.
